# **Oil**

- -extraction platforms mainly in the North Sea
- -> also in the Norwegian Sea and Barents Sea
- -first oil field was discovered in 1969
- -> has been used heavily since then
- -oil extraction in the north is more complicated
- -harsh weather conditions (cold, storms etc)
- -region has a poor infrastructure
- => North Sea has already been exploited in big parts -> industry moves up north Greta Beunink

# Natural gas

- largest gas field in Norway: Troll (40% of all of Norway's gas reserves)
- fields in the **north** of Norway are situated offshore:
  - -> Goliat (8 bcm)
  - -> Snøhvit (193 bcm)
  - -> gas transported to Melkøya LNG plant (Hammerfest) by pipeline
- 30% of the EU's natural gas supply is imported from Norway (2023)



bcm = billion cubic metres tcm = trillion cubic metres

# **Hydropower**

(generation of electricity by utilising the natural flow of water; afterwards returned to the natural water cycle: renewable energy)

- -> perfect conditions in Norway (long coastline, many fjords...)
- => 291 hydropower plants which generate 96% of Norway's electricity

#### benefits:

- cheap energy (~0.12€ per kWh)
- reliable and stable source
- flexible and adjustable based on the desired amount of energy

#### problems and conflicts:

- destruction of landscape and vegetation
- use of space: conflicts with indigenous peoples in the northern regions



### **Demographic changes**

- relatively low birth rates (1.55 births per woman in 2021)
- => lower than in Germany (1.58 births per woman in 2021)
- decline in births in 2009
- overall most people are aged between 20 and 60 source: Weltbank

#### **Shortage of skilled workers**

- unemployment rate at record low of 1.8% (NAV, 2023)
- -> Norwegians find jobs easily, but too many jobs remain unfilled
- sectors that are particularly affected in Norway:
  - -> secondary sector (mainly engineering and manufacturing)
  - -> tertiary sector (mainly healthcare)
